pointing it toward the front of the store instead of toward the back.

I wanted to scream "Stop it!
Stop!" and felt an impulse to stuff my fingers into my ears to block out the song.

In previous years, I loved the Christmas season—Christmas carols, Christmas shopping, and the jingle of bell ringers. But not this year, my first Christmas after my husband died. In fact, I wanted to avoid anything that resembled

our family's previous Christmas celebrations before my husband died. I realized it would be too hard to repeat our old traditions without him.

That's when my daughters and I made some decisions to eat together a week *before* Christmas at Famous Dave's Barbecue. There would be no aroma of turkey, dressing, or pumpkin pie there! The change was just what we wanted and needed.

Then I flew to Alaska and spent Christmas Day with my sister and her family—in the bleak, frozen North, vastly different from our Christmas Past in Kansas. I wished my husband had been able to enjoy Alaska with me, but that was no longer possible. Yet I still made new memories that I cherish today.

Our past Christmas memories have a way of haunting us, flooding our minds with wonderful, vivid memories of what used to be. But grief brings harsh reminders of what will never be again.

For some who have experienced a loss, it may be important to try to relive and reenact the same Christmas Past family traditions as closely as possible; others may need a total change. Either way is okay—whatever is most helpful to you. Grieving can be as individual as each of us—we all handle stressful situations differently.

During this holiday season, you can make choices as you face your new Christ-mas Present. Think about ways you can honor your loved one, maybe by telling stories, lighting a candle, or looking at pictures.

There are no rule books or road maps for coping with the holidays after a loss. So consider ways to protect your heart by including activities you enjoy in your holidays. Don't forget to schedule adequate periods of rest for yourself.

As you make choices to take care of yourself during the upcoming holiday season, give yourself permission to make new memories which are meaningful, memorable, *and* enjoyable.

Since grief takes no holidays, it is all right for you to choose to take little holidays from grief in the next few weeks. I wish you a wonderful Thanksgiving and a blessed Christmas Present.

munication of orders can be done immediately. Our medical director can easily access the patient chart. The transition has created a lot of changes for our organization. Processes are completely different. Team members have taken on different tasks that could not have been done in the field prior to implementation.

Change creates uneasiness-things are different from how they were before. I believe that change is good, but there are times when change hurts our hearts. I believe the changes we encounter in everyday life prepare us for the changes that hurt.

When the change you face is due to the loss of a loved one, you are left facing a difficult transition from life before your loved one passed to life after your loved one passed. I've had several losses over the last few years. As time has passed, the pain has lessened, but I still miss my loved ones.

One day I was looking out my office window to take a break from focusing on my computer screen. The most beautiful cardinal was sitting on the bush outside my window peeking in as if to say "hello". I have had several encounters with this beautiful cardinal since that day. I started to notice that I had a sense of peace when that cardinal would peek in my window. Something about its presence was so soothing to my soul.

The cardinal is a bird that has many meanings and thoughts associated with it. Christians see the cardinal color red as symbolic of the blood of Christ and the hope humanity gained from his resurrection. Cardinal is the name as well as the color worn by the highest priests in the Roman Catholic Church. The number 12 is associated with the cardinal. Cardinals are seen during all 12 months of the year. The nest of a cardinal often contains 12 eggs. Native Americans consider the number 12 to be a lucky number. Native American tradition holds that if you have encountered a cardinal, expect good luck to follow, possibly in 12 hours, 12 days, or at noon or midnight. As I was looking up the many meanings of a cardinal, there were several references to the cardinal being a special hello from heaven.

So whether the cardinal is truly a visit from my beloved ones or not, the point of it is that the presence of the cardinal brings me peace. It gives me an opportunity to think about those that I have lost and how life has changed since their passing. A moment to remember the things that make those loved ones dear to me. It gives me a minute to remember their story and share it with my children. I think it is healing to find what brings you peace amidst change. Whether yours is a cardinal, a rainbow, a song, or a smell, it is significant to you and it is your moment of peace.


